In this two-session workshop, we will first explore our relationship to the material possessions in our lives, discerning what is "enough" and how this supports us in focusing on what's most important to us. Then we'll examine how our possessions enmesh us in relationships and societal patterns that embody and engender peace and justice, or violence and war. We'll explore, as John Woolman, an 18th century Quaker, suggests: "May we look upon our treasures, and the furniture of our houses, and the garments in which we array ourselves, and try whether the seeds of war have nourishment in these our possessions, or not."
